## **Call for Papers and Submission Information**

Because of the Journal's focus on bring research to practice, we encourage a mix of empirical research with policy-oriented and practice based articles. Examples of topic areas include (but are not limited to) –

- systematic case studies of districts, schools, or classrooms that have successfully enacted a balanced, comprehensive curriculum.
- policy analyses of the implications of standards-based education for all students.
- approaches to closing achievement gaps among student populations.
- relationships among standards, curriculum, and assessments.
- enacting meaningful, high quality curriculum and instruction within the contest of high stakes assessments.
- teacher evaluation and/or professional development that target and support a balanced and comprehensive curriculum.
- evaluations of the effectiveness of innovative curricula.
- connections between P12 and higher education, especially as these affect P12 practice and policy.

### **Guidelines for Writers**

Papers submitted for publication should be between 1500 to 7500 words in length. Those articles intended for practitioner use are recommended to be 1500 to 3000 words in length. Both of the length requirements stated are recommended but articles that exceed the recommended length will not be excluded solely based on this feature. However, authors must regulate length in relationship to the importance of conveying content.

We accept articles/papers that are written using the American Psychological Association reference style. Therefore references are cited in text like this (Duke, 2002) and listed at the end of article in bibliographical form. All articles must include a full reference list at the end of the article. Refer to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (Fifth Edition)* for matters of style. Authors bear full responsibility for the accuracy of citations, quotations, figures, and facts.

If the manuscript includes graphs and charts that are pertinent to text submit each item as a separate file with notations in text indicating location of placement within text. Make sure that text, graphs, and charts are labeled clearly and correspond appropriately to ensure proper placement within text for reviewers and editors.

CLR will accept pictures for publication when they enhance the meaning of text. At the time of submission of manuscript note the availability of applicable pictures and their place within manuscript text. If the manuscript is accepted for publication CLR will notify the author for submission of electronic version of pictures.

Manuscripts are accepted by email submission only. A submission consists of two copies of the manuscript, one submitted in standard APA style, and the second "BLINDED" version. The manuscripts are to be submitted in either WORD or RICH TEXT format

**Originality of Manuscript:**

Manuscripts are accepted for consideration with the understanding that they are original material and are not under consideration for publication elsewhere.

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We require that authors who submit articles for publication in the Journal do not submit manuscripts that have been published or are being considered for publication elsewhere.

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**Review Process:**

Manuscripts will be acknowledged by the editors upon receipt. After a preliminary editorial review manuscripts will be sent to reviewers. The Journal is peer-reviewed, by at least three reviewers with expertise in the subject of the submitted article. The three peer reviewers will consist of two researchers and one practicing professional. We use the blind review system, so submissions should contain information identifying authors on the cover page only.

The review process can be expected to take from 2 to 4 months. Authors should expect to hear from editors within that time regarding the status of their manuscripts.

**Editing:**

The Journal reserves the right to edit manuscripts for clarity, format, and size. We work closely with author to ensure that editing maintains intent and quality of the manuscript; therefore, edits are subject to approval by the author. Authors will receive an edited version of their manuscript for their review, correction, and approval by email.
